## MRHD Awards \$1.2 Million Dollars to 15 Siouxland Organizations

SIOUX CITY – Missouri River Historical Development (MRHD) distributed \$1.2 million in grant funds to 15 local Siouxland organizations today as part of their annual Impact Match Grant Awards Ceremony and Reception at the Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center. Around 100 people representing various nonprofit organizations and local governments attended.

MRHD's Impact Match Grant program offers funding awards from \$25,000 to \$250,000 for 1-year to support a variety of projects or programs in 5 categories:

- 1. Economic Development, Community Improvement, Tourism
- 2. Human Services, Health Services
- 3. Civic, Public, Charitable, Patriotic, Religious
- 4. Leisure, Cultural, Historical
- 5. Education

"We're thrilled to distribute \$1.2 million into the community today through our Impact Match Grant program," said Steve Huisenga, MRHD Board President. "The organizations and projects we funded today reflect MRHD's ongoing mission of enhancing the quality of life for all people who live in Woodbury County," said Huisenga. "We're thankful for our great partners at the Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Sioux City, whose ongoing support allows us to make these continued investments back into the community."

MRHD is the non-profit organization that holds the license for gaming in Woodbury County. Its funding is generated from an agreement between MRHD and Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Sioux City which allows Hard Rock to run a gaming operation in Woodbury County using MRHD's gaming license.

Since MRHD and Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Sioux City formed their partnership in 2014, MRHD has invested over \$32 million in the community. In total, MRHD has provided more than \$50 million in local grant funding for projects that improve the quality of life for people in Woodbury County since their grants program began in 1994.
